MEASURES AT GOEL DENTAL TO MAINTAIN DENTAL SERVICES AMIDST CORONA VIRUS THREAT

Goel dental has identified Do's and Don'ts and essential dental services based on recommendation of IDA and ADA. Dental emergencies are potentially life threatening and require immediate treatment to stop ongoing pain, discomfort and infection.

Do's

- Give complete details about your travel and any related illness.
- Wash your hand with soap and water many times in a day.
- Use a mask only if you have cough or running nose.
- Keep yourself updated with latest developments.
- Avoid unnecessary gatherings and travel.

Dont's

- Do not come if you have fever, sore throat, cough
- Do not come if you have history of international travel in last 14 days.
- Do not come if you have history of contact with a positive COVID 19 case.
- Don't bring attendants and children as visitors in dental clinic.
- In any of the above situations contact your nearest Government health facility or call helpline number 01123978046

CONDITIONS FOR WHICH YOU SHOULD SEEK IMMEDIATE TREATMENT

- Mild to Severe Dental Pain
- Wisdom teeth pain
- Tooth fracture resulting in pain and soft tissue trauma.
- Localized pain and swelling.
- Crown dislodgement.
- Ongoing Root canal procedure.
- Extensive caries with pain.
- Faulty fillings causing pain
- Suture removal.
- Post-operative follow up (Implant, surgery etc).
- Ongoing orthodontic procedures.
- · Children having dental pain and swelling

CONDITIONS FOR WHICH TREATMENT CAN BE POSTPONED

- New orthodontic cases
- New implant cases
- Painless caries
- Extraction of asymptomatic teeth
- Routine dental cleaning
- Cosmetic procedures

MEASURES TO PREVENT RISK OF CROSS INFECTIONS AT GOEL DENTAL

- No appointment to foreign national till 30th April.
- No case with fever, cough or sore throat accepted for treatment.
- No case with history of international travel in last 14 days accepted for treatment.
- Every patient is examined and treated using disposable consumables and sterilized equipment.
- Entire operatory is disinfected with sodium hypochlorite after each patient.
- Surgeries are undertaken after wearing full Personal protective equipment.
- New set of equipment is used for each patient.
- Biomedical waste management guidelines are followed thoroughly.
- Good hygienic practices and sanitary measures followed.
